Pottsgrove School District 2019 Satisfaction and Communications Survey

We want to thank all the parents, students, community members, and PGSD staff who participated (412) in this survey and provided us with such rich information. We value your feedback and will use the survey results to help improve our ongoing work. This year our results show an increase in satisfaction and overall communication. Complete results and a three-year summary can be found [here](#). Below is a summary of the results:

- 94% - agree we are keeping students safe and secure
- 93% - say we are providing sufficient classroom and instructional space
- 93% - agree we are providing access to and instruction in 21st Century technology
- 92% - feel the district maintains a high standard when communicating with parents and students
- 91% - feel well informed about the staff, events, and activities at the school(s) their children attend
- 90% - feel well informed about policies/procedures at the school(s) their children attend
- 87% - feel the district maintains high academic standards
- 83% - feel informed about their child's academic progress and areas that may need to be addressed

Participants were asked what score they would give the Pottsgrove School District that reflects their overall satisfaction on a scale from 1 to 10:

- All responses averaged to 7.2
- The most common rating is 8.0
- 75% of the responses were a 7 or above

As a result of the survey feedback we received, we will be focusing on the following areas during the 2019-2020 school year:

- Instructional Practices that improve individual student achievement
- Data review process and analytic framework or measuring growth
- Understanding Principals of Behavior to Build Successful Classrooms
- Asking for, and responding to public input
- Create action plans and review data on closing the achievement gap
- Preparing non-college bound students for careers after high school

Our goal is to engage all stakeholders to both seek and provide, timely, relevant communication, so that the Pottsgrove School District can best serve our children academically, socially and emotionally.
